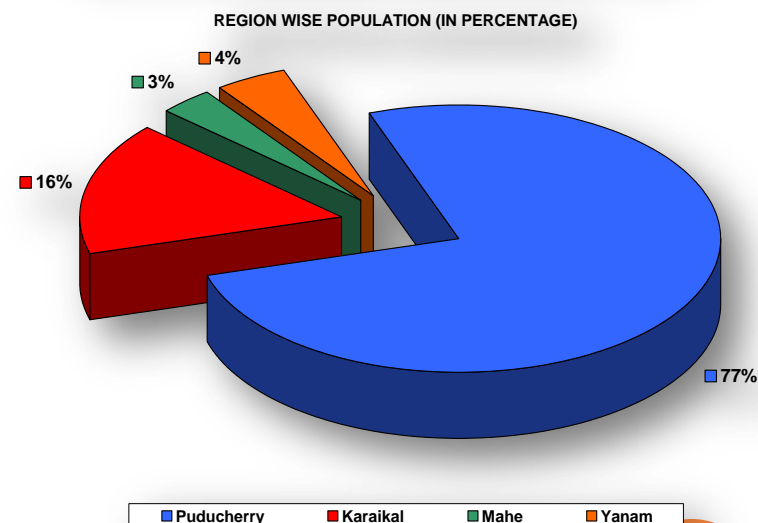

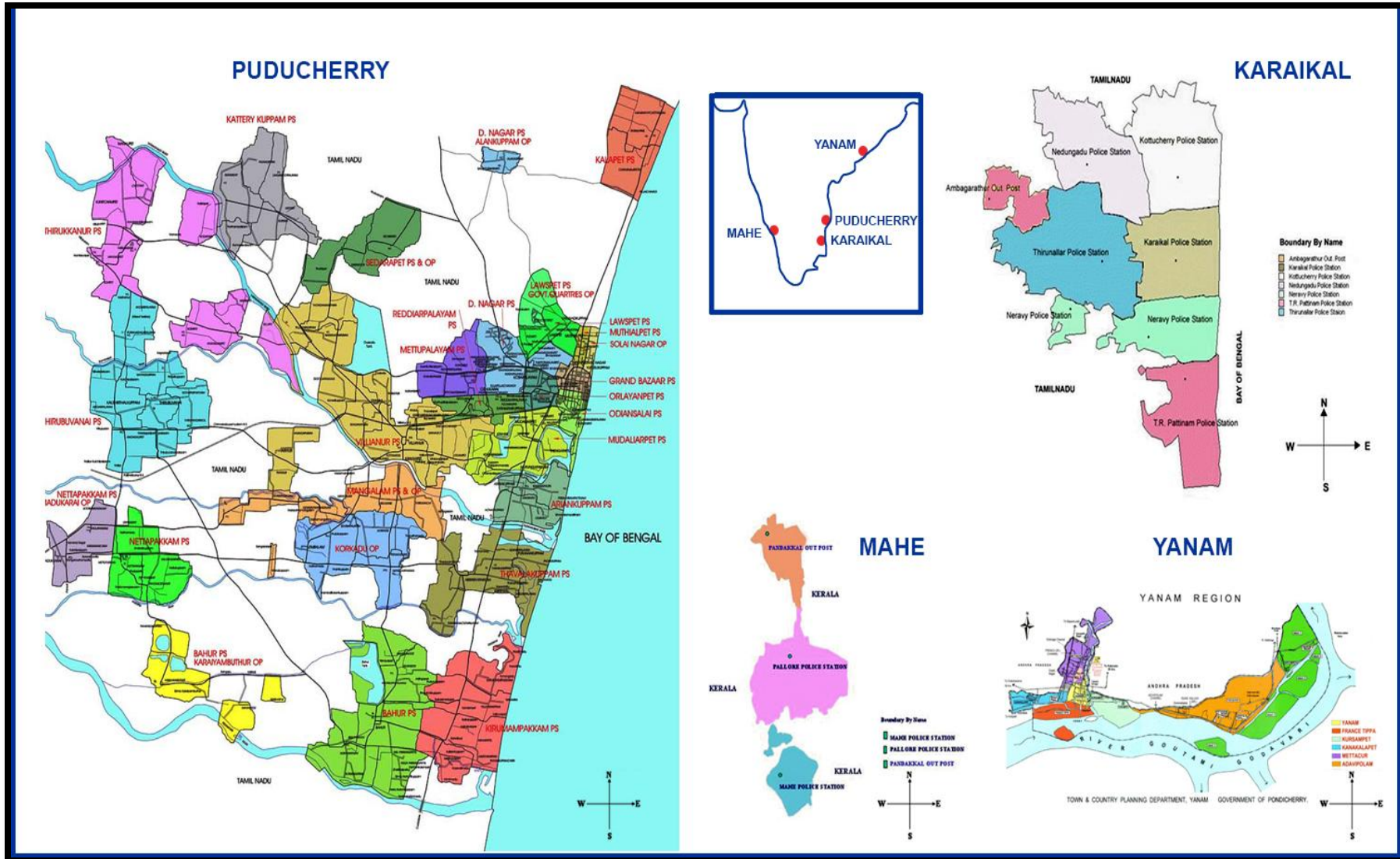

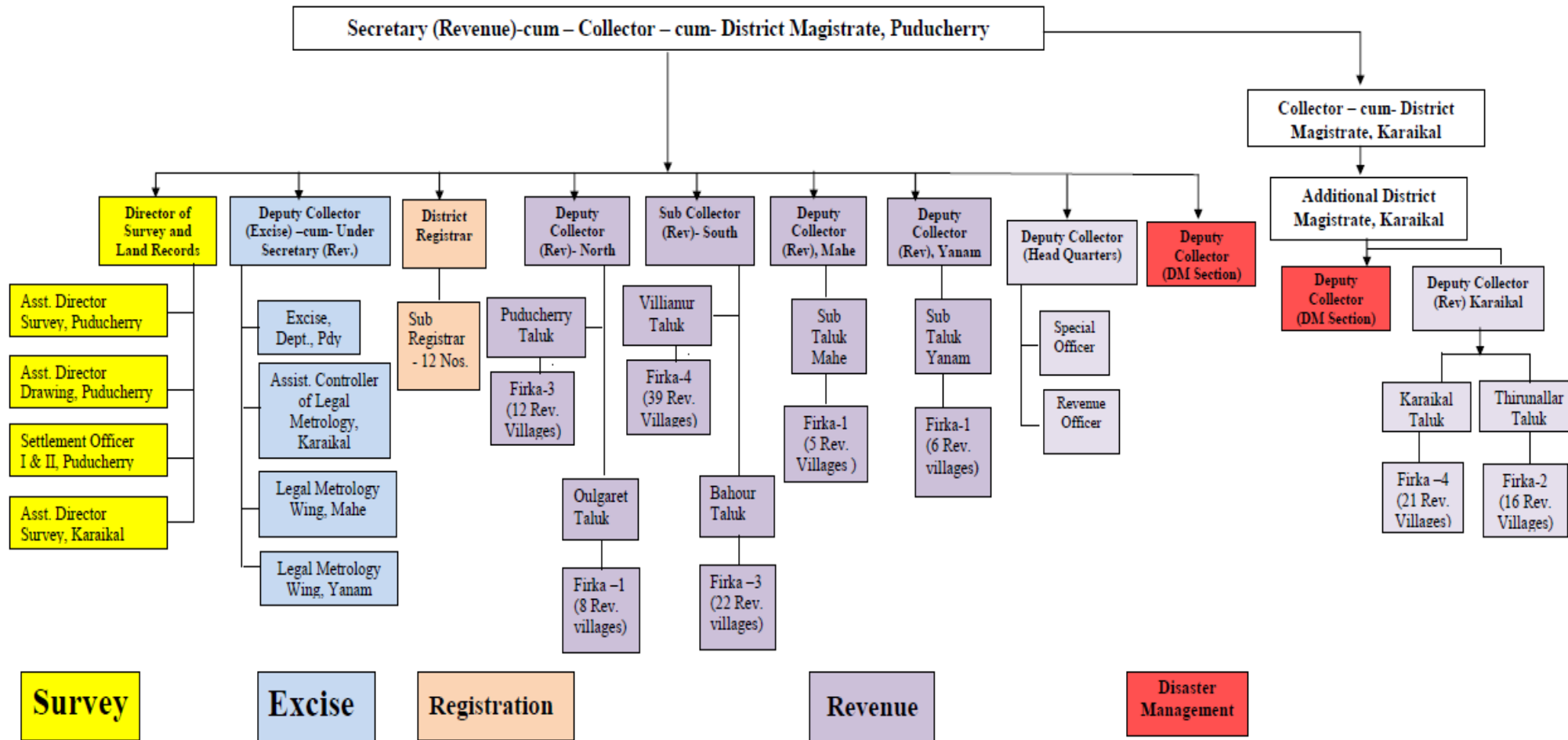

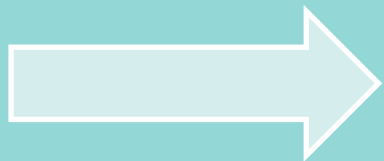

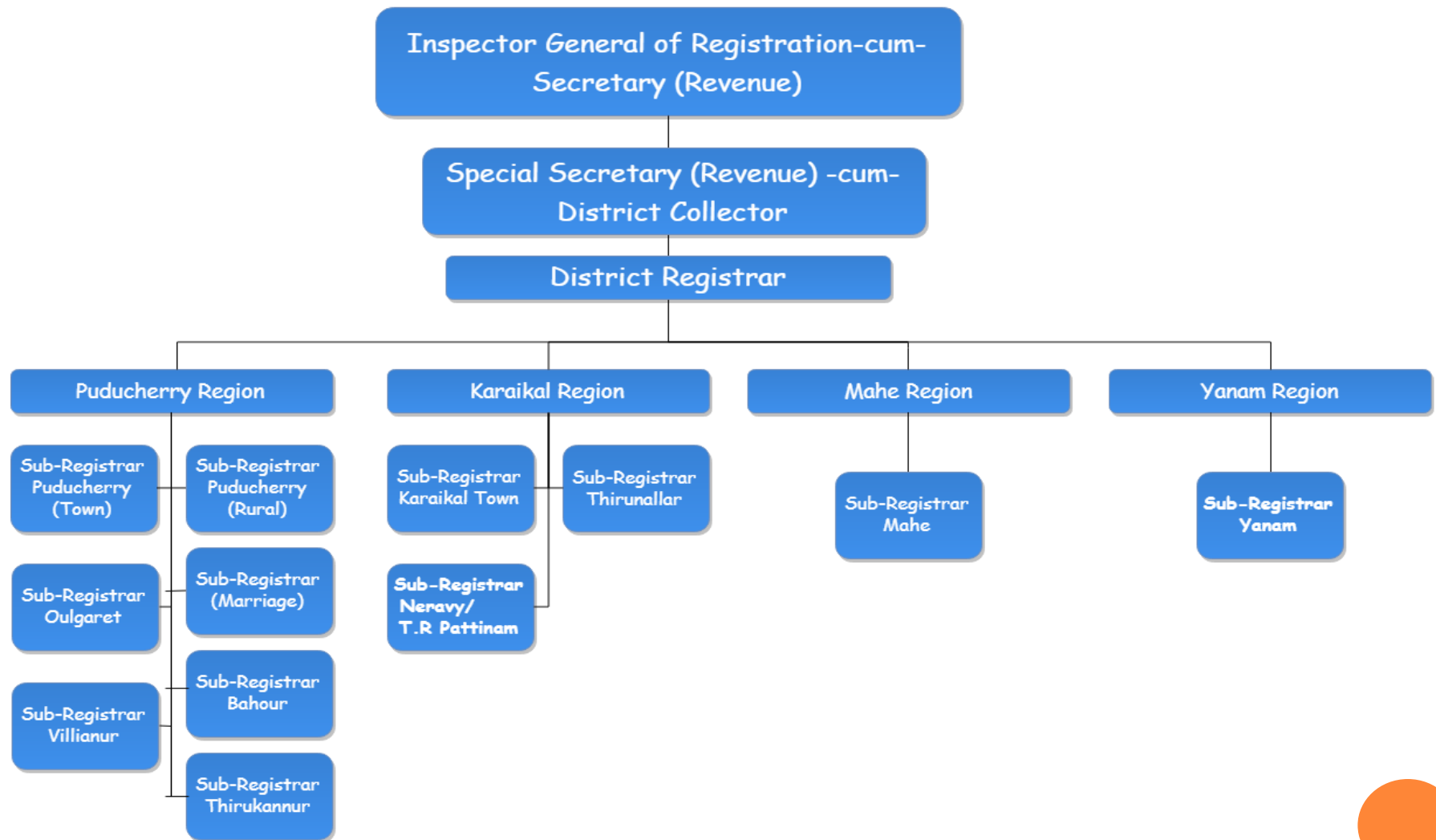

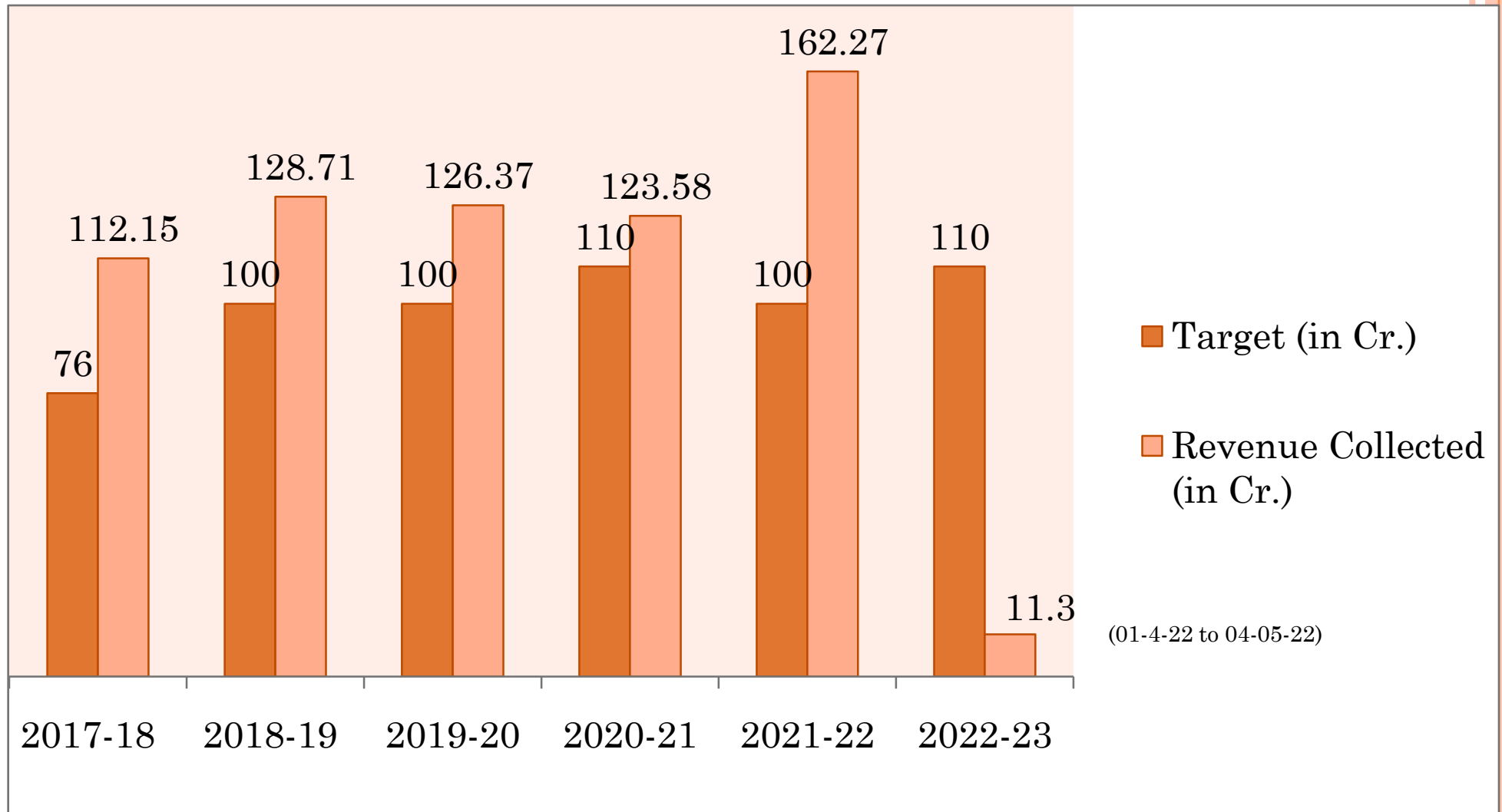

EXCISE REVENUE 2021-2022

- ❖ The Finance Department has fixed the target of Rs.1036 Cr for the FY 2021-22.
- ❖ Despite the Covid pandemic, the Department was able to achieve collection of Rs.1071.93 Cr.
- ❖ Excise Revenue crossed the Rs.1000 Cr mark for the first time in the UT of Puducherry.



SPECIAL EXCISE DUTY IMPOSED @ 20%

- ❖ Govt. of Puducherry has fixed a revenue target of Rs.1000 crores to Excise Dept. for the financial year 2021-22
 - ❖ In order to meet the targeted revenue receipts, SED was levied at an uniform rate of 20% across all brands w.e.f. 15.07.2021.
 - ❖ Average monthly revenue receipts increased to 100 crores as against the previous collection of 65 crores.
 - ❖ Increase in prices of liquor due to imposition of 20% SED does not have major impact on the sales of liquor but the sales of premium brands, wine and beer has shown declining trend.
 - ❖ Sales of certain high end premium brands have only reduced due to increase in prices but the volume of sales of such brands will be meagre.
 - ❖ 60% of the market share is contributed by cheap segments brands which has shown a slight drop in sales (5 to 10%).

SENDAI FRAMEWORK FOR DISASTER RISK REDUCTION

- The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) Scheme is being implemented in this UT of Puducherry, under the financial assistance provided by National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), New Delhi.
- The MoU was signed between the NDMA and Govt. of Puducherry for the implementation. Accordingly, one Senior Consultant has been engaged since 16/09/2021.
- The scheme is being implemented for a period of 3 years from the date of signing of MoU and NDMA provide an amount of Rs. 55.85 lakhs under the scheme. So far, the NDMA released an amount of Rs. 12.50 lakhs and the same has been accounted in the State Budget.

A.1.5 AAPDA MITRA

A.1.7. ESTABLISHMENT & OPERATIONALISATION OF CIVIL DEFENCE IN PUDUCHERRY

- As per the instruction of Directorate of Civil Defence, MHA, Government of India to activate Civil Defence in the Categorized Districts, the Government of Puducherry initiated action to set up Civil Defence Corps during the year 2015 and again revamped the process of establishing Civil Defence in the year 2021.
- 40 volunteers were selected and given 8 days basic training in relief & rescue operation, First Aid techniques and activities of various Departments during disaster situation. Resource person various Departments, Fire & Rescue Department, NDRF and NGO specialized in Rescue & Relief operation shared their knowledge and gave hands on training to Civil Defence Volunteers.
- All those 40 trained volunteers were successfully inducted into Civil Defence Force of Puducherry after due approval of Government.

E. MAJOR CAG OBSERVATIONS




E.1. Report of the CAG for the year ended March 2019

3.12 Failure of Registering Officers of the Registration Department of Puducherry in implementing the orders of UT Government of Puducherry has resulted in non-withdrawal of concession of stamp duty and transfer duty surcharge amounting to 1.52 crore granted to women property.

Scrutiny of 925 instruments registered in the District Registry, Puducherry and Sub Registry, Oulgaret" during the period 2013-14 to 2017-18 revealed that, in 71 cases, the women purchasers who availed the concession of 50 per cent of stamp duty and transfer duty surcharge on purchase of properties had subsequently executed deeds of alienation within five years of such purchase.

Recommendation: Government may instruct the Department to adhere the instructions issued by the competent authority and collect the duty and fees accordingly without any omission.

Action taken by the Department: Necessary steps are being taken to recover the remaining 50% women concession stamp duty of all the referred 65 cases.



E.2. Report of the CAG for the year ended March 2017

3.10.5.4 Non-establishment of connectivity between sub-registries and taluk offices

Integration between sub-registries and taluk office records was envisaged in the project to issue patta, based on the registered documents. However, it is observed that digitisation of index register prior to 2008 was not completed (July 2017) by the Registration Department. Further, fresh re-survey/ survey and updating of all survey and settlement records were also not conducted. The Department of Survey stated (April 2017) that surveys and updation would be conducted under a centrally sponsored scheme. Since these two Departments did not complete the above task, the automatic mutation with revenue records at the time of registration of documents under e-Pathiram was not achieved.

Action taken by the Department: The Department has already integrated the Land Records Software “Nilamagal” and Registration Department Software “e-Pathiram”. The Registration particulars are sent electronically daily to the concerned Taluk Tahsildars in Form-13A for issue of Pattas.

E.2. Report of the CAG for the year ended March 2017

3.10.4 Levy of stamp duty on agreements relating to sale of securities / shares

A perusal of the data collected from Multi Commodity Exchange of India Ltd. (MCX) and National Stock Exchange (NSE) showed that there was a turnover of Rs. 2,16,620.45 crore from the residents of Puducherry in these exchanges for the period from 2013-14 to 2015-16.

The rates of duty for these instruments were also due for revision as they were formulated in 1899. At the rate applicable in the State of Tamil Nadu (0.006 per cent), the duty on the above turnover would have yielded a stamp duty of Rs.13 crore for the three years. The Registration Department is responsible for ensuring collection of the same.

During Exit Conference, the Secretary stated that the system prevailing in the State of Tamil Nadu would be studied and feasibility of implementing the same in UT of Puducherry would be considered.

Action taken by the Department: At present stamp duty is levied only on transactions of conveyances. The Department would obtain concurrence of the Finance Department to levy stamp duty on agreement and shares as observed by the CAG.

E.3. Report of the CAG for the year ended March 2018

2.3.2 Failure of the Project Implementation Agency to avail the excise duty exemption resulted in avoidable expenditure of Rs.54.47 lakh

Government of India approved Rs.188 crore for Union Territory Government of Puducherry under CDRRP in 2014-15 and released the funds to the Project Implementation Agency (PIA) between September 2014 and March 2015 for undertaking works under CDRRP. The CDRRP was financially assisted by the World Bank.

Scrutiny of records (March 2017) relating to three packages awarded to two private firms (November 2015) revealed that the contractor procured the materials required for the project at a cost of Rs.4.36 crore including excise duty of Rs. 54.47 lakh. The contractor failed to avail the excise duty exemption as per the Central Excise notification mentioned above in spite of clause 13.3 of the agreement which clearly specified the procedure to be followed.

It was in the interest of the implementing authority to ensure that the central excise exemption was availed. Thus, payment of excise duty to the materials procured, without availing the exemption notified by GOI for WB aided project had resulted in avoidable expenditure of Rs.54.47 lakh under the project.

Action taken by the Department: The Project Implementing Agency has informed that the remarks pointed out by the Audit will be taken for further guidance.



F.MATTERS PENDING WITH GoI



GLR REDUCTION IN RESPECT OF CHINNAYAPURAM

- The proposal for reduction of GLR Value in respect of lands at Chinnayapuram has been approved by the Council of Ministers by circulation and the same was submitted to the former Lt. Governor, Puducherry.
- The Lieutenant Governor, Puducherry after perusal of the resolution of Cabinet, had not agreed with the proposed reduction in Guideline value for Chinnayapuram area, and thus referred the matter to the Government of India for a decision
- The Ministry of Home Affairs in turn has requested for the comments of the Government of Puducherry and the same was prepared and submitted to the Government of Puducherry for Approval



DRAFT LAND PURCHASE POLICY

- The Govt. of Puducherry has proposed a land purchase policy on voluntary basis rather than through the compulsory process of acquisition to ensure timely and litigation-free availability of land for development projects of the Government.
- The Draft Land Purchase Policy duly approved by the Council of Ministers was referred to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, for appropriate decision by the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, vide D.O. Letter dated 14.09.2019.

PROPOSALS TO AUGMENT REVENUE



REVENUE AUGMENTATION MEASURES

- A detailed GO prescribing procedure for revision / updation of Guidelines values (GLR) has been proposed. On implementation this would reduce the gap between GLR and Market Values thereby contributing higher revenue in the form of Registration fees, Stamp and Transfer Duty.
- Revision of Court fee in line with the rates of Tamilnadu Court fees is being proposed.




REVENUE AUGMENTATION MEASURES

- End to End computerization to track the movement of liquor from manufacturing stage to consumer end has been initiated with the help of NIC.
- Merger of first three AED slabs thereby fixing the minimum rate of AED at 81 rupees.
- Increasing the minimum cap fixed for imported brands from the declared price range of Rs.600 to higher level
- Digitization of various permits viz., Transport, Import, Export using Digital Signature Certificate (DSC) to avoid human interaction.
- Levy of MRP based duty for liquor to avoid multiple tax structures.



REVENUE AUGMENTATION MEASURES

- GPS tracking of consignments carrying ENA to be imported by the distilleries in the UT of Puducherry.
 - SED was levied for the purpose of additional revenue augmentation measure and it has yielded the desired result. However, the sales volume of premium brands was reduced due to increase in prices of such liquor compared to that of the price of liquor in the neighbouring states. Liquor Traders Association made a demand to reduce the rate of SED from 20 % to 10 % for premium, beer and wine as their business prospects got affected due to increase in prices of liquor due to levy of 20% SED.
 - Sale data analysis will be done and based on its outcome, further course of action will be taken by the department.

PUDUCHERRY DISTRICT E-GOVERNANCE SOCIETY (PDeGS)

○ **Formation of Society:**

- In pursuance of the Guidelines for National Roll out of e-District Mission Mode Projects (MMP), Puducherry District e-Governance Society (PDeGS) & Karaikal Puducherry District e-Governance Society (KDeGS) have been constituted under the Chairmanship of the respective District Collectors.
- The purpose of the Society is for the implementation of e-District project for over all benefit of citizens by setting up necessary administrative, financial, legal and technical framework, implementation mechanism and resources in the district of Puducherry.



PUDUCHERRY DISTRICT E-GOVERNANCE SOCIETY (PDeGS)

○ Activities undertaken under PDeGS

- Selection of Village Level Entrepreneurs (VLEs) for establishment of Common Service Centre (CSC) in all Gram Panchayats and Municipalities of Puducherry District.
- Data Digitization of Index Registers of all Sub Registrar Offices in Puducherry, Karaikal, Mahe and Yanam regions.
- Purchase of Desktop computers, printers, scanners for VAO / RI towards facilitating issue of online certificates.



○ Financial Support for PDeGS

- Funds for functioning of the PDeGS is obtained as Grant-in-Aids from Government of India, Government of Puducherry and CSC SPV, New Delhi.
- Apart from the above a share of services charges collected from CSCs is credited by the Directorate of Information Technology, Puducherry annually to PDeGS.
- Initial seed money of Rs.10 lakhs for each region (Puducherry, Karaikal, Mahe and Yanam) amounting to a tune of Rs.40 lakhs has been contributed by the G.O.I. for establishment and functioning.
